Additions / Changes to the Agenda:

The Director reported that there were no changes to the Agenda; the Board received a handout for Superior Laser and Aesthetics Institute, Superior, which is on the agenda under "H" Student Complaints/Matter of Non Compliance/Legal Action, #2.

Staff and Director Report:

Director Parker reported that Littleton Academy of Hair Design closed and ceased operations effective May 12, 2010, and that the Division is working with a couple of cosmetology schools to arrange a teach-out for the six students affected by the closure.

Staff reported that all contingency approvals concerning last month's Board actions had been met; recorded; and were on file.

New Business / Action Items:

A. Consideration of Renewal of Certificate of Approval

1. 5 Star CDL Academy, Inc. - Grand Junction

Program Specialist Esquibel brought to the Board's attention for consideration of renewal 5 Star CDL Academy, Inc., Grand Junction. School representatives were present. The school

satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required minimum surety level in the amount of \$9,030; that the school submitted a certificate of deposit in the amount of \$9,030; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Douglass moved that the Standard Certificate of Approval be granted to 5 Star CDL Academy, Inc., 2591 B-3/4 Road, Grand Junction, CO 81503, for the period beginning July 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2013. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

The combined motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

Plus Real Estate School, Inc., Thornton. A school representative was present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

A school representative was present. Based upon the Board having determined that the above-referenced courses for Peak Real Estate College, 3091 South Jamaica Court, Suite 120, Aurora, CO 80014 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Narvaez moved to approve the above-referenced new courses effective May 25, 2010. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

E. Consideration of Approval of Out of State School

World Wide College of Auctioneering – Mason City, IA

Program Specialist Belisle brought to the Board's attention for consideration of renewal World Wide College of Auctioneering, Mason City, IA, for Consideration as an Out of State School. The Board having determined that the school surety level be set in the amount of \$50,000, and that World Wide College of Auctioneering, 202 1st Street, SE, Suite 103, Mason City, IA 50401 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and the minimum requirements of the Division, Mr. Douglass motioned that the Standard Certificate of Approval be granted for the period beginning July 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2011. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

F. Consideration of Change of Ownership

1. Colorado CDL Training School - Trinidad

Program Specialist Oerman brought to the Board's attention for consideration application for a change of ownership for Colorado CDL Training School, Trinidad. School representatives were present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. The Board having determined that the school bond be set in the amount of \$7,200; that the school complied and submitted a bond in the amount of \$10,000; and that Colorado CDL Training School, 2118 Freedom Road, Trinidad, CO 81082 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Ms. Bennison Noll moved that the change of ownership be granted for the period beginning May 25, 2010 and ending June 30, 2012. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

H. Student Complaints/Matters of Non Compliance/Legal Action

1. College America - Denver

After review and due deliberation, the Board finds the school adequately responded to the Notice of Noncompliance; actions have been taken by the school to ensure that no further misrepresentations shall be and remedies have been taken to correct the situation. Motion was made by Ms. Hall that the Board has reviewed and considered the response provided including the letter directed it the unregistered agent. It finds that CollegeAmerica Denver, has satisfactorily responded to the Board's initial concerns and has taken necessary action to prevent its agents and employed and persons acting as unregister agents from engaging in any further conduct that may be interpreted as inappropriate and misleading recruitment and sales practices prior to the Board approve to offer a program. The Board hereby moves that this matter be administratively closed. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

2. Superior Laser and Aesthetics Institute - Superior

The Board indicating it would like to consult its legal counsel before further discussion or action, Mr. Martin, Chair, called for a motion to convene in executive secession pursuant to \$24-6-402(3) (a)(II), C.R.S., to confer with the Board's attorney regarding legal options available concerning Superior Laser and Aesthetics Institute, Superior and to receive legal advice on specific questions related thereto, and pursuant to \$24-6-402(3)(a)(III); to

discuss personnel data required to be kept confidential pursuant to section §12-59-105.4. Ms. Bennison Noll so motioned; it was seconded; and duly passed. Members of the general public left the meeting room. The regular public board meeting recorder was turned off, and the Board of Private Occupational School duly convened into executive session at 10:54 A.M. for the purposes described above as requiring confidentiality. No member of the general public was present. The executive session recorder was turned on.

Executive session having concluded, the public session of the Board meeting reconvened at 11:04 A.M. The executive session recorder was stopped and the regular public meeting recorder was turned on. Members of the general public and school representatives were invited to once again attend.

Assistant Attorney General Candler affirmed for the public record that the Executive Session was for the sole purpose of providing legal advice to the Board and to otherwise engage in what in good faith is believed to be an attorney-client privileged discussion or complaint matters required to be kept confidential.

After due deliberation and discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Douglass to direct the Division to send a Notice of Noncompliance to Superior Laser and Aesthetics Institute, Superior, and provide reasonable time to respond, matter to be reviewed at the June, Board Meeting. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

Other Business:

A. Required Contract Language for any Surety Bonds or Surety Bond Alternatives

After review of forms, Mr. Douglass motioned that forms be accepted as recommended for school use. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

Adjournment:

Having no further business, Mr. Narvaez moved for adjournment. The motion was seconded and passed. The Board meeting adjourned at 11:08 A.M.
