Addendum to CCHE Agenda Item II C

Senate Bill 23-005: Forestry and Wildfire Mitigation Workforce Expansion Grant Recommendations

Section 5 of SB 23-005 authorizes the expansion and creation of degree and certificate programs at state institutions of higher education, local district colleges, and area technical colleges through a FY24 appropriation of \$1,180,650 and \$780,650 in FY25.

Per CRS 23-1-142(3):

Funds may be used for: "(I) Program design and administrative expenses necessary to expand or create the forestry programs; (II) The acquisition of a simulator for the forestry program once the program is established, which may be shared with forestry programs at other public institutions of higher education; and (III) Any other costs associated with expanding existing forestry programs or creating a new forestry program."

Below are Department staff recommendations for funding for Years 1 and 2. Funding proposals have been reviewed by both the Department of Higher Education and the Colorado State Forestry Service.
