Conference Goals:

- ✓ For AP AFRICAN AMERICAN STUDIES: 1) Review the curriculum for the future Advanced Placement course in African American Studies and determine alignment with the content and competencies of one or more categories in GT Pathways; 2) explore opportunities to develop advanced collegiate studies opportunities for students who complete the AP African American Studies course; 3) advise on the potential addition of a multicultural/social justice course requirement to GT Pathways
- ✓ For BIOLOGY: Continue efforts to “Revisit, Revise, and Renew” the Statewide Transfer Articulation Agreement in Biology to improve its Simplicity, Transparency, and Portability; consider separate agreements for students pursuing 1) health/medical/cellular major/concentrations; 2) field/environmental/general biology majors/concentrations; 3) other majors/concentrations as deemed viable and beneficial to students; discuss development of a genetics course that better aligns with pathways
- ✓ For INDUSTRY CERTIFICATIONS: Review recommendations from CCCS faculty for transferable course credit awards for select industry certifications in computer science and technology; affirm alignment with GT Pathways or courses in a Statewide Degree Transfer Agreement if merited; advise on how industry certifications might be incorporated as a learning opportunity within degree pathways
- ✓ For MATHEMATICS: Review the revised International Baccalaureate Maths curriculum to 1) affirm alignment of revised courses with GT-MA1; 2) affirm/determine MA-1 institutional course equivalencies for IB exam scores of 4; 3) affirm/determine institutional course credit awards for IB exam scores of 5, 6, and 7
