- 3. Announcements and Discussion Items
 - Updates from CCHE Advisor Michael Lightner
 Dr. Lightner informed Council members that the CCHE's next Commission meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 24 – he will have a more robust update at the next Council meeting.
 - b. Higher Learning Commission (HLC) Reduced-Credit Bachelor's Programs (Zach Waymer, HLC, 1:30 pm)

Zach Waymer, Government Affairs Officer, and Stephanie Kramer, Director of Accreditation Systems, discussed a variety of topics with Council members regarding the decision from HLC to allow for reduced-credit bachelor's degrees. They reviewed the background, different scenarios, application, guidelines, and substantive change review and decision processes. They also provided resources for institutions who may wish to pursue this avenue.

Carl led Council members in a robust discussion regarding institutional concerns about how reduced-credit bachelor's degrees would be received by several stakeholders, most importantly students. Carl assured council members that the Department would engage in a mindful, deliberative, and proactive process that would allow institutions to make informed decisions. Carl also informed council members that Department staff would consult with the Colorado Office of the Attorney General regarding whether a statutory change would be needed to allow institutions to offer reduced-bachelor's degrees.
