

History of the state OER grant program

- 2017: Senate Bill 17-258 forms the OER Council and establishes the grant program
- **2018:** \$550,000 awarded to fund 20 grants
- 2019: \$1 million awarded to 35 institutions
- **2020:** \$875,000 awarded to 27 grants
- 2021: Senate Bill 21-215 funds the program for 5 more years at \$1 million annually and \$875,000 awarded to 27 grants
- **2022:** \$968,803 awarded to 20 grants
- **2023:** \$960,018 awarded to 25 grants



2022-2023 COHORT 4 GRANTEES

18 Institutional grants

2 small group grants

20 Colorado public institutions

11 cohort 4 proposals were awarded two-year project grants

students in Colorado are enrolled in a course with OER grant materials annually

\$31.5 million

The first 4 years of the Colorado OER grant program has brought the reported savings for students to over \$31 million - from a \$3.4 million investment.

Zero Textbook Cost Degrees

- Colorado State University B.A. Spanish
- Colorado School of Mines launched M.S. in mechanical engineering in Fall 2023
- Multiple institutions offer A.A. and A.S. Z-degrees, including Community College of Denver and Metropolitan State University of Denver
- University of Colorado Denver is presently undertaking a B.S. in mathematics
- Arapahoe Community College is pursuing Z-degrees in communications and astronomy

2023 Request for Proposals Changes

- Expansion of grant award categories
- Eligibility to address automatic textbook billing programs
- Emphasis on collaborative and Z-degrees with the goal of \$500,000 to be awarded to z-degree proposals

Eligibility

- Institutional Grants are open to any public postsecondary institution in the state of Colorado as defined in C.R.S. Title 23, which is inclusive of institutional systems.
- Individual or Small Group Grants are open to any faculty, instructor, or staff member employed by a public institution of higher education in the state of Colorado.
- Collaborative or Partnership grants may be among multiple institutions of higher education, including private institutions, or regional campus collaborations, or for courses taught in local K-12 school districts. Public institutions of higher education must be the lead applicant.
- Institutions with automatic textbook billing programs, often referred to as inclusive access and equitable access programs, are not eligible for the grant type 4: general incentive fund during this cycle.

Grant award categories

- 1A: Complete General Education / AA + Major Z-degree
- 1B: Major Coursework Z-Degree
- 2A: Collaborative
- 2B: Collaborative Z-degree
- 3: Small group
- 4: General Incentive Fund
- 5: Individual Course

33% of proposals were for Z-degrees

One-third of proposals received for Cohort 6 of the OER grant program were to adopt or create OER to prove a zero textbook cost degree pathway.

Grant timeline

September 2023: RFP Release

October - November 2023: Grant webinars and office hours

December 18 2023: OER grant proposals due

January 2024: Review of grant proposals

February 2024: Recommendations for awards to CCHE

March 2024: Award notifications

May 2024: Funds to be disbursed by CDHE

January 2025: Progress report due

June 30 2025: All grant funds must be spent down

July 2025: Remaining funds return to CDHE

August 15 2025: Final reports due

How proposals were evaluated

- Selection criteria
 - Project description, impact to enrollment and cost, institutional support, how it aligns to current needs, strength of implementation plan and timeline, how the project addressed DEI and accessibility, sustainability, and evaluation plan.
- Rubric was made public
- Colorado OER Council members were assigned to review

Sustainability

- Sustainability was a metric when scoring proposals
- Z-degree are significant culture change for departments
- Partnerships between institutions indicate sustainable collaboration
- Examples of commitment from institutions:
 - Dedicated librarians, instructional designer time for OER
 - Funding for professional development

Trends in Cohort 6 OER Grants

- Zero Textbook Degree development
- Faculty led collaborative projects
- Nursing coursework at five institutions

Recommendations for OER grants

- \$1,000,000
 - 1 two year grant from Cohort 5
 - 11 general incentive fund grants
 - 9 institutional Z-degree grants
 - 4 collaborative grants
 - 4 individual grants
 - 1 small group grant
- Largest amount awarded \$100,000
- Smallest amount awarded \$3,500
