Approval of the April 24, 2012 Board Meeting Public Session Minutes:

The Board reviewed the April 24, 2012 meeting minutes. Mr. Martin moved for approval of the minutes as read. The motion was seconded and passed.

Additions / Changes to the Agenda:

Section E. Student Complaints / Matters of Non Compliance / Legal Action was added to the agenda, for an update regarding CollegeAmerica – Fort Collins.

Staff / Director Report:

Director Parker reported that all contingency approvals concerning Board action taken at the April 24, 2012 meeting have been met, recorded and are on file with the Division.

The Director also informed that "Senate Bill 12-164" passed as part of House Bill 1155 and primarily affects those proprietary postsecondary institutions coming under the Colorado Commission of Higher Education (CCHE), not the Division/Board. Director Parker added that the intent of the legislation is to more closely align CCHE's regulatory process in respect to schools coming under the Degree Authorization Act with those regulated by the Private Occupational Education Act, which the Board administers. He added that this legislation takes effect on August 8, 2012. Deputy Director Roberts noted that only two aspects of the House Bill concern Division/Board processes: (1) Board terms will now be staggered; and (2) under one specific allegation (deceptive sales or trade practices aka "misrepresentation") there is an student complaint filing prerequisite; however, this prerequisite expressly only

applies to a claim of deceptive sales or trade practices and not to other issues that may arise.

Lastly, Director Parker indicated that his replacement should be announced in early June.

A. Consideration of Approval Programs / Stand Alone Courses

1. IntelliTec College – Colorado Springs

Program Specialist Oerman brought to the Board's attention for review and consideration one new program, Biomedical Equipment Technician, AOS, proposed by IntelliTec College, Colorado Springs. A school representative was present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Based upon the Board having determined that the above-referenced program for IntelliTec College, 2315 E. Pikes Peak Avenue, Colorado Springs, CO 80909 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Martin moved to approve the above-referenced program effective May 22, 2012. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

2. Intellitec Medical Institute – Colorado Springs

Program Specialist Oerman brought to the Board's attention for review and consideration two new programs: (1) Associate of Applied Science – Dental Hygienist; and (2) Associate of Applied Science – Business Administration with a Concentration in Entrepreneurship, proposed by Intellitec Medical Institute, Colorado Springs. School representatives were present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Based upon the Board having determined that the above-referenced programs for Intellitec Medical Institute, 6805 Corporate Drive, Suite 100, Colorado Springs, CO 80919 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Douglass moved to approve the above-referenced programs effective May 22, 2012. The combined motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

3. The New Colorado Outdoor Adventure Guide School - Mesa

Program Specialist Oerman brought to the Board's attention for review and consideration one new program, Cowboy University #1, proposed by The New Colorado Outdoor Adventure Guide School, Mesa. A school representative was present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Based upon the Board having determined that the above-referenced program for The New Colorado Outdoor Adventure Guide School, Mesa, CO 81643 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Martin moved to approve the above-referenced program effective May 22, 2012. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

B. Consideration of Renewal of Certificate of Approval

1. Medical Sales College - Englewood

Program Specialist Viteri brought to the Board's attention for consideration of renewal Medical Sales College, Englewood. School representatives were present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$272,000; that the school submitted letter of credit in the amount of \$300,000; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Sirbu moved that the Standard Certificate of Approval be granted to Medical Sales College, 8310 South Valley Highway, Suite 220, Englewood, CO 80112, for the period beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2015. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

2. Pacific College of Allied Health - Lakewood

Program Specialist Viteri brought to the Board's attention for consideration of renewal Pacific College of Allied Health, Lakewood. A school representative was present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

Street, Suite 1950, Greenwood Village, CO 80111, for the period beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2015. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

6. International Academy of Elite Esthetics & Micropigmentation - Englewood

It was the will of the Board to consider all in one action. The Board after determining that all thirteen out-of-state schools each meet the minimum requirements as set forth in 12-59-111(2), C.R.S.; that each school's bond be set in the amount of the statutory minimum of \$50,000; that the thirteen out-of-state schools each demonstrate compliance with the bond requirements pursuant to 12-59-115(8), C.R.S.; and that all thirteen schools can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and with the minimum requirements of the Division, Mr. Martin motioned that in respect to all thirteen out-of-state schools identified herein, the Standard Certificate of Approval be granted for the period beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013. The combined motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

School representatives were present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$520,399; that the school submitted verification of Training Assurance Foundation (TAF) coverage in the amount of \$520,399; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Douglass in a combined motion moved that a Provisional Certificate of Approval be granted Redstone College – Denver East, 7350 N. Broadway, Denver, CO 80221 for the period beginning May 22, 2012, ending June 30, 2013, and that the program before the Board be approved. The combined motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

E. Student Complaints/Matters of Non Compliance/Legal Action

1. CollegeAmerica – Fort Collins

Assistant Attorney General Salazar updated the Board about the status of the proposed Stipulated Agreement with the Fort Collins location concerning matters of Noncompliance found in respect to two filed student complaints.
